



Interior designer Fawn Galli and her husband, architect Julio Salcedo, bought this Cobble Hill townhouse 10 years ago, living in a 2,000-square-foot duplex and renting out the home's two additional floors. The owner of an eponymosly named design firm, Galli was quick to put her vintage-meets-contemporary stamp on the decor. "I like mixing different styles-Old World, modern, rock & roll-and creating spaces that are unique," she says.
