



## Apartment voyeur

A designer's Cobble Hill haven



Interior designer Fawn Galli and her husband, architect Julio Salcedo, bought this Cobble Hill townhouse 10 years ago, living in a 2,000-square-foot duplex and renting out the home's two additional floors. The owner of an eponymously named design firm, Galli was quick to put her vintage-meets-contemporary stamp on the decor. "I like mixing different styles—Old World, modern, rock & roll—and creating spaces that are unique," she says. Housewares and furniture plucked from flea markets and local shops like Blu Dot and Holler

& Squall outfit the three-bedroom, one-and-a-half-bathroom pad, where the couple live with their two young sons, Gaspar, 9, and Laszlo, 6.

1 "This is the heart of the house," Galli says of the combined dining room and library. Custom walnut bookshelves flank the decorative fireplace, and a digital work by local artist Meghan Boody hangs above the mantle. The acrylic-rod light fixture is from Manhattan interiors boutique Design Within Reach.

2 Bold pops of color throughout the house include the handwoven silk drapes by Laos designer Carol Cassidy. The fiberglass deer in the living room is a Chelsea Flower Market find that Galli painted black. "I like how it's unexpected and surreal," she shares.

3 Galli bought this raffia and paper butterfly from Pearl River Mart, which is set to shutter later this year. "It's a tragedy that it's closing," she says. The gold clock is a George Wilson design, first made in the 1950s.—Leah Faye Cooper
